

### REPORT







## Report of the Webinar on Media literacy & fact-checking workshop cum training (Screenshots attached)

### Fundamentals and Applications of Nonlinear Optics

Nonlinear optical (NLO) behaviour is exhibited by all materials, in varying degrees, when they are irradiated by intense laser beams. The applications of NLO may broadly be classified into four areas, mainly (i) diversification of lasers and coherent light, (ii) Advanced Spectroscopy and Analysis, (iii) Material Processing, and (iv) Optical Communication. Harmonic generation, optical parametric oscillation etc. belong to the diversification of lasers, while Coherent Anti-Stokes Raman Spectroscopy, Four-wave mixing spectroscopy etc. are examples of advanced spectroscopic techniques. Material ablation by multi-photon absorption is an example for laser material processing, while effects like stimulated Raman and Brillouin scattering have an active role in optical fiber communication. The initial part of this talk will briefly discuss the theory of Nonlinear Optics, and the final part will focus on the applications mentioned above.

**DAY 1 - 20-11-2020**

**REPORT**

**20/11/2020**

“The two day Webinar on Memory Studies” organised by the PG Department of English, Sanatana Dharma College, Alappuzha was inaugurated on 20-11-2020. The technical team created link to join the meeting via Google meet on 19-11-2020 itself and e-mails were sent to all the participants on the same day, sharing adequate information about the meeting and its schedule. The inaugural session started at 9:30 am. The technical team started recording the meeting and the moderator Ms. Jeena Johnson gave a brief welcome and outlined the theme of webinar. The meeting started with a prayer by Ms. Bhagya.S, third year B. A. English student of SD College, Alappuzha. Shortly, the Webinar Coordinator, Mrs. Neetha Prasad delivered the welcome speech. The welcome speech was followed by the presidential address by Dr. Leena P. Pai, Head, Department of English, SD College. This was followed by the inaugural address by Sri. P. Krishnakumar, Manager, SD College. After the programme was inaugurated, Dr. P. R. Unnikrishna Pillai, Principal of SD College delivered his felicitation. It was then followed by felicitations by Dr. T. R. Anilkumar, Vice-Principal of SD College and Dr. P.S. Parameswaran, the IQAC Co-ordinator. The inaugural session, ended with the vote of thanks proposed by Dr. N. Saraswathy Antaranjanm, Associate professor of English, SD college at 10 am.

The first lecture of the series was conducted on 20-11-2020 at 10 am. Dr. Merin Simi Raj, Assistant Professor in English at IIT Madras was the invited resource person. The topic of the discourse was “Nostalgia, Narrativity, and Postcolonial modernity”. The link to the meeting via Google meet was same as that of inaugural session. Dr. Merin Simi Raj joined the meeting at 9.50 itself and the first plenary session commenced at 10 am with a total of 77 participants. Ms. Jeena Johnson was the moderator of the session. Dr. E. Krishnan Namboodiri, Associate Professor, SD College welcomed and introduced the resource person with a short description of the topic of the session. The discourse began considering fiction and narrative as an important tool for analysing memory. The speaker then analysed the technological, political, cultural shift from historical knowledge, that is, ‘what we know’ and ‘how we remember it’ giving reference to *Abhijnana Shakuntalam* and the role memory playing in it. She then elaborated on the role played by technology as an ally in memory studies, drawing an instance from one of the memory conferences that she had attended that is, how artificial reality was used to animate a mural painting of Jallianwala Bagh massacre and generated a memory out of technology. She further elaborated that first instance of memory outside human memory was printing and then photography, which can be considered as a major technical shift. She points out how fiction becomes an intermediary platform which could remind official histories about what they have forgotten citing examples of Salman Rushdie’s *Midnight Children* where he presents the historiography by giving different kinds of a nation’s story, altogether, which sometimes complements the official version. She then pointed out the evident connection between nostalgia and modernity, that is, how narratives enable the interface between memory and modernity, citing Hayden Whites work *Metahistory* in which he elaborates on the impossibility of writing history without narrative. According to her, the historiographic narrative is a combination of ‘activity of narrative’ and

'structure of narrative'. She eloquently throws light on importance of narrative , that is, the impossibility to engage with identity without narrative and how narrative is the heart of all types of histories. She then points out the importance of nostalgia, which is a twilight zone between memory and history. She then elaborates on the history of nostalgia as an aftermath of industrialisation and imperialism which used memory as a restorative tool to rebuild losses, referring to the book *The Future of Nostalgia* by Svetlana Boym. Nostalgia can be considered as a negotiation between tradition and modernity, another dimension of memory. She analyses post colonial modernity in fiction (Salman Rushdie's *Midnight children*) in corollary with the history of Anglo-Indian communities. She then points out that the markers of postcolonial modernity is not same, it can be gender based or caste based etc. Writing, which was a male enterprise give way to women , after getting access to education. It can be considered as a negotiation of transition from traditional to modernity. She concludes her lecture by considering various possibilities to engage nostalgia with time. The lecture ended at 11.10 am and the interactive session which followed was very engaging. Very relevant questions and doubts arousing the curiosity of the speaker and participants were asked and posted in the chat box as well. The first plenary session ended at 11.10am with a vote of thanks proposed by Dr. Bindu Nair, Associate Professor, SD College. A link to the feedback form was also provided to the participants. It was an enlightening lecture and this was justified by the feedback of the participants.

Technical sessions 1 and 2 started simultaneously at 11.30 in two separate link created in google classroom. The first technical session was carried on in the same link generated for the inaugural session. The session commenced at 11:30 AM with 37 participants and the chair was adorned by Dr. Bindu Nair, Associate Professor, Department of English SD college. Mr. Akhil Krishnan, II MA English hosted the meeting, and introduced the six paper presenters and their topic for the session. In the introducing speech Dr. Bindu Nair gave a warm welcome to the six presenters and the whole participants. The first presentation started at 11:40 AM by Dr. Nisha, Assistant Professor of English Government college, Attingal on the topic "*Mapping loss stories told, retold and untold in "Devils Valley"*". Jaya Selvi, research scholar, Stella Maris, Chennai presented the topic "*Decoding cognitive dissonance of post truth minds': Kota Neelima's "The honest season"*", Sreekala B, Faculty NSS college pandalam presented paper on "*Memory as counter narrative" a subaltern Ramayana*", Abhilash VJ, ResearchScholar, Department of English, North Eastern Hills university, Meghalaya, presented the paper "*Benyamin's goat days; a nostalgic memory of "Home" in an unromanticized diasporic life signaling transition in the society*". Lekshmi Mohan, Assistant Professor, NSS college pandalam, presented the topic "*Reminiscing Reading glimpse of Keralite reading of culture*" and Meera Prasannan, Faculty, NSS college Changanacherry presented the topic "*Identity and memory A study on Michel Odantjie's: "The English patient"*". Each paper was presented for a duration of seven minutes. The papers were presented till 12:30 PM. A fruitful discussion was held after presentations. Towards the end of the session, the audience were asked to fill up the feedback form to share their experience and to provide suggestions for the future endeavours. The session ended with the vote of thanks proposed by Ms. Bhagya Suresh, III BA English at 1PM.

Technical session 2 comprised 5 paper presentations. The session started at 11.30 AM with 25 participants. Dr. E. Krishnan Namboodiri , Associate. Professor, Department of English chaired the session and Amal K. S of 2nd MA English moderated the session. The first speaker was Ms. Thejmol George, Assistant Professor, St. George's College, Aruvithara and she presented the topic "*Memories as Ghosts: Ruined Past of Srilanka in Michael Ondaatje's Anil's Ghost*". Then Niveda Gokuldas, Guest lecturer, NSS college Nemmara, Palakkad presented her paper on the topic "*Whether to survive*

*or die: An analysis of the Vegetarian*". *"Self and Identity: A Study of Select Dalit Autobiographies"* was the third paper and was presented By Anju A Palavila, Assistant Professor, Govt Arts College, Trivandrum. Siva Sam U S, Asst. Professor, University College presented his paper on the topic *"Archiving the Past: A reading of Thoppil Bhasi's Play "Ningalenne Communistakki" as a Historical Document "*. The final presentation was on the paper *"Memory and Trauma: A reading of Siddhartha Gigoo's "The Garden of Solitude"* By Parvathy Mohan, Assistant Professor, NSS Hindu College, Changanacherry. An active interactive session followed the presentations. Towards the end of the session, the audience were asked to fill up the feedback link to share their experience and to provide suggestions for future activities. The session ended with the proposal of vote of thanks by Ms. Sivapriya .

Plenary Session 2 began at 2.02 pm with 49 participants and the participants increased to 80 by 3.00 pm. The resource person for this session was Dr. M.N .Parasuraman , Associate Professor, Department of English, University college and the topic of discourse was "What one needn't remember: Memory, convenience and literary canon". Miss Karthika R, Assistant professor, Department of English, introduced the speaker Dr. M N Parasuraman to the audience. Ms. Bhagya Suresh, English student , moderated the complete session . Speaker Dr. M.N Parasuraman began his talk at 2.10pm. In the introductory part of his discourse he expressed his fascination on the sub theme of 'manipulation' of memory and according to him it is the first question to be resolved. He raised a wide range of questions on memory, whether we get to choose memory, whether it is spontaneous. He further enquired whether memory is something private or public or memory spoken/ unspoken ,or memory written or unwritten or whether it was tutored / untutored. He talked about literary canon, literary history and historiography as well. He gave importance to the term syllabi as it is a live manifestation of canons in the lives of students. He elaborated on the dangerous equation between memory and knowledge. Another question put forwarded by the speaker was the relation between memory and change. He further enquires whether past is a reliable guide to the present. By quoting TS Eliot, he raised a relevant question whether we want the pastness of the past or do we want its presence. He questioned the examination system and syllabic patterns existing in our country .He picked up the concept of Margaret Masterman who talked about different learning paradigm which once existed and continues to exist nowadays in our society. Literary canons permeate society on many levels and have undoubtedly shaped everyone's world view. He further elaborated that examining the pitfalls of canonization can help to illuminate many evils which are yet to be overcome. As an advocate of the LGBTQ, he frankly expressed his disagreements with J K Rowling. He mentioned Dale Spender and her work, *"The Mother of English Novels"*, which strongly argues that the English novel was brought into existence by women. The core part of his talk and presentation was based on the responses he got from the questionnaire he had prepared. By analysing the responses of nearly 30 students he concluded that most of the people among younger generations are looking for an overall empowerment, they want to read subaltern being empowered, and wanted to see the changes mirrored in the syllabus. He concluded by proving through the responses that most among them are not looking for the pastness of the past rather its presence. By 3.00 pm the speech ended and the session was opened for discussion and the interaction lasted till 3.25pm. Dr. Parasuraman made a significant remark in the interactive session that "knowledge postponed is knowledge denied". He ended the session by stating that "It's not a crime to be canonized". Towards the end of the session, the audience were asked to fill up the

feedback link to share their experience and to provide suggestions for future activities. This delightful session ended with the vote of thanks proposed by Mrs. Saritha.M ,Assistant Professor of English at 3.26 pm.

Technical session 3 comprised of 5 paper presentations. The session started at 3.30 PM with 37 participants. Ms.Saritha ,Assistant Professor, Department of English chaired the session and Ms. Bhagya Suresh ,3<sup>rd</sup> BA English, moderated the session. The first speaker was Linda P Joseph, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Carmel College, Mala and her paper was titled *"Digitally Frozen Memory: Deliberation on the authenticity of Recollection"*. Then the next speaker , Niranjana G, Research Scholar, VIT, Chennai presented her paper on the topic *"Convergence of the individual and collective memory in the biography of Anandibai Joshee"*. The 3<sup>rd</sup> speaker , C. M .Meera, Research Scholar, Research and Post Graduate Department of English, St. Aloysius College, Elthuruth, Thrissur brought the topic *"Co-optive versus Coercive: An Enquiry into the Violence and Manipulation of Memory in select plays"* into the presentation. Her paper was titled *"Memory of the past, culture, hybridity and conflict of the present in Season of Migration to the North"*. “The two day Webinar on Memory Studies” organised by the PG Department of English, Sanatana Dharma College , Alappuzha was inaugurated on 20-11-2020. And the second day of the National seminar commenced on 21-11-2020 which comprised of 2 plenary sessions , 5 technical sessions and a valedictory session..The technical team created link to join the seminar via Google meet on 20-11-2020 itself and e-mails were sent to all the participants on the same day, sharing adequate information about the meeting and its schedule.Plenary session 3 began at 9.30 am with 17 participants and by 10.58 am the number of participants increased to 65. Dr. Harsha Vishwanath ,Assistant Professor, Department of English, was the invited resource person and the topic of discourse was,“ *Repression and Dissociation: The Psycho dynamics of Individual and Collective Trauma* ”.This session was moderated by Ms. Anila Chandran,2<sup>nd</sup> MA English student. Dr. Saraswathy Antharjanam, Associate Professor, Department of English, introduced the speaker to the audience . The technical team started recording the session and the Resource person Dr. Harsha Viswanath started the session at 9.32 am. Dr. Harsha Viswanath divided her entire talk into three different sections.The first 15 minutes of her session was an introduction to the area of trauma studies. The speaker put forward the reality of the existence of trauma from a long period of time. She pointed out the reason for this long term existence - the paradigm shift in power tactics which was obsessed by the growing need to dominate ,in order to distract the world from the principles of humanity . She shared a power point presentation of the topic and was successful in capturing the attention of each and every participants. Introductory part can be considered as an attempt of the speaker to make every participants aware and to develop interest in trauma studies. According to the speaker, in the present scenario the term trauma actually refers to a psychological or emotional damage. Speaker then mentioned about Kin Erikson and his article named ‘*Notes on Trauma in Community*’,which mentions that trauma can be a result from a constellation of life experiences. It can be from anything danger, sudden terror experiences, from a continual abuse and it can be also from a moment of shock. She considers trauma to be a very stressful event or incidents having a threatening nature like accidents, witnessing violent death , and also natural and man made disasters. So trauma according to her seems to have a powerful capacity to shape human’s physical , emotional and intellectual development.The negative effects which mainly contribute to the survivors were the war and the atrocities which resulted in multiple layers of traumatic experiences. She also elaborated on the significance of trauma studies from Freudian time, since trauma studies relied much on Freudian theories. In order to make the session captive she presented a video named “ *The Burning child*,”which was about the story of a father and his son. In this video the viewer can see the father being in a situation where he lost his son and how the trauma of losing a very dear one affects human minds through dreams. Later it can be seen as a kind of traumatic experience where the sufferings and extreme mental psyche experiences of the person experiencing it, cannot be represented wholly through language and poses a challenge to the limits of language. She concluded the introductory section of her talk by saying that traumatic people who had intense experiences started experiencing denial and traumatized psyche starts self traumatizing, there will

be repression and dissociations both at social and individual levels, and victims will find life situations re- traumatizing.

The second section of her talk was on virtual trauma. She used pictures of Taj attacks, holocaust, riots and natural calamities which depicted the notions of history and events once took place. According to her, close reading of those pictures can create a cultural trauma and also a reflection in our minds. Those pictures can describe the shock of the events but were frequently used for manipulation and political use. The picture which included a man holding hands sympathetically struck her attention and that picture could help her recollecting her own past traumatic experiences. She narrated her own personal experiences and she concluded that the traumatic experiences not only affect the mental psyche of victim, instead it could indirectly create a big impact on the dear ones which ultimately leads to a collective experience. Referring to the rape incident of a 19 year old covid patient girl in Kerala, Dr. Harsha Viswanath pointed out the deep impact it had created in the minds of women. Through a survey regarding the same issue, she proved that this incident has traumatized women. She concluded her second section by highlighting that these kind of issues happening in our society can create a virtual trauma having a great impact on people and it ultimately leads to the traumatising of a whole society. Third session of her talk focused on the need of trauma writings and representation of trauma through narratives. Speaker further elaborated on the different perspectives on traumatic experience. She pointed out that a literary text allows scope for the subject of trauma with personalized, fictionalized, historicized as well as psychologized and metaphorised approaches. She then elaborates on the unspeakability and unnarrativity of the traumatic experiences through language representations. Then the speaker described about the term ethnic cleansing and referred to the traumatic situations happened to Nadia Murad and Farida Khalaf. She concluded her whole session at 10.33 am by pointing out the notion of trauma as trans-historical and intergenerational, stating that traumatic experience is repetitious, timeless and unspeakable. The session concluded with informative discussions till 10.55 am. Participants were free to ask questions and comment their opinions in the chat box. Towards the end of the session, the audience were asked to fill up the feedback form to share their experience and to provide suggestions for the future endeavours. Ms. Devi S, Assistant. Professor, Department of English, gave the vote of thanks at 10.56 am. The whole session ended successfully at 11 am.

Technical sessions 5,6 and7 started simultaneously at 11am in three separate link created in google classroom. The fifth technical session was carried on in the same link generated for the third plenary session. Technical session 5 began at 11.am with 29 participants and by 11.06 the number of participants increased to 33. This Session comprised of 6 paper presentations. Mrs. Devi.S, Assistant Professor, Department of English, chaired the session and Anila Chandran of 2nd MA English moderated the session. The first presenter of this session was Mrs. Karthika . R, Assistant Professor, Dept of English, SD College, Alappuzha. Her paper was titled "*Memories and Memoirs: Re-tracking the Self Through Railway Memoirs.*" The second presenter, Drisya K, Assistant Professor, Department of English, NSS College, Pandalam, presented paper on the topic, "*Strategy of Memory Loss to Minify Psychological Trauma: Tracing Memory as a Tool to Deconstruct 'The Vein of Memory'*". Ashmita Bora, Research Scholar, IIITG & Nasiruddin S.K, Post Graduate( EFLU) was the next presenter and their paper titled "*Looking at Memory and Trauma From Gender Lenses: A Study of Select Novels on Partition*". Srushti Ravisingh Zala, Research Scholar, S. H. Gardi Institute of English and CLS, Saurashtra University, Rajkot was the fourth speaker and her presentation was on the paper titled "*Clementizing LGBTQ(ETC) Representation in Select Bollywood Movies*". Then Parvathy J, Research Scholar, Kalasalingam Academy of Research and Education, Krishna Kovil, Tamil Nadu presented her paper on the topic '*Memory in Maus: A Survivor's Tale*'. The final

presentation was on the paper “*Memory as a Reflection of Trauma and Journey to Self and Social Identity*” by Rajat Kumar Maurya and Tariq Mehmood, Research Scholars, Central University of Haryana, Department of English and Foreign Languages. Discussions on topics presented by speakers were carried on and all participants were free to comment their doubts and opinions in the comment box. The session 5 was concluded with the vote of thanks proposed by Ms. Bhagya, BA English student, at 12.35 pm.

Technical session 6 commenced after the third plenary session at 11 am with 14 participants. The links for the technical sessions were already emailed to the participants. The session comprised of 7 paper presentations. Dr.E.Krishnan Namboodiri, Associate Professor, Department of English, S D College, Alappuzha chaired the session. Mrs Jeena Johnson, 2<sup>nd</sup> MA English hosted the session and introduced the seven paper presenters and gave a hearty welcome to the participants. The first presentation was done by Arun kumar C.S, Assistant Professor, Govt College, Manathavady on the topic “*Memory in Eco-Dystopias: A Reading of See*”. This was followed by the presentation on topic “*Nolan's Memento: A Chilling saga of Identity, Trauma and, Memory*” by Harsha. M. Byju, IInd MA English, Union Christian College, Aluva. Next paper was presented by Shivangi Kanojia, MPhil Research Scholar, University of Delhi on the topic “*Phayul: Studying Tibetan Narrative of Trauma, Exile and Homecoming.*” This was followed by the presentation by Maria Teresa Raju, Student, Bharat Mata College, Thrikkakara on the topic “*Wars of Memories: Two women’s struggles to preserve the memories of their husbands amidst hostility and oppression*”. Next presentation was on the topic “*The Role of Memory Studies in the Biography of Madam C J Walker*” by Benasir Banu M S, Research Scholar, & Evangeline Priscilla B, Assistant Professor, VIT, Vellore. The last presentation of this session was done by Nimmy Stephen, 2<sup>nd</sup> MA English, Holy Cross College, Trichy, Tamil Nadu on the topic, “*Anxieties of Memories: The Girl on the Train as a Trauma*”. The paper presentations of this paper ended at 12.10 pm and the session was open for discussions. This session came to an end with the vote of thanks proposed by Mr. Ben Tom Raphy, 3<sup>rd</sup> BA English at 12.30 pm.

Technical session 7 commenced after the 3<sup>rd</sup> Plenary session at 11:00am. The technical team posted the link via google meet at 10.30 am and had 14 participants at beginning and then it increased to 21 participants. Ms. Aparna U, Faculty, Department of English, S D College, Alappuzha chaired the session. Ms. Sivapriya, 3<sup>rd</sup> B A English hosted the session and introduced the six paper presenters and gave warm welcome to the participants. The first presentation was done by Baby Karmily Mishana Victor, Student, M A English, The Cochin College, Kochi on the topic “*Gloomy Sunday : Recollecting the ‘Hungarian Suicide from a war torn era*”. Then Pavana P Varma, Student, M A English (Cafeteria) EFLU, Hyderabad, presented the topic “*Do we not Bleed?- Analysis of Theyyam as a mode of transfer of Collective Memory*”. Amal K S, Student, M A English Literature, S D College, Alappuzha presented the topic, “*The Fact and opinions behind the name Theresa*”. After that Pulikottil Joel Nelson, Student 2<sup>nd</sup> BA English, MES College Marampally, Aluva presented the topic “*Manipulation of Memory and Mind using Social Media*”. Each presenters was allotted a time of 7 minutes for their presentation. The papers were presented till 11.45 A M. Two other presenters couldn’t present their paper due to technical issues from their side. The session was open to discussion from 11.50 am.. The session was highly fruitful and many participants shared their thoughts and asked questions to the presentors about the above presentations. The session was concluded with the Vote of thanks proposed by Ms. Abhirami, 2<sup>nd</sup> M A English at 12:10 PM.

Plenary session 4 began at 2 PM by the link generated by technical team via google meet. Mr. Akhil Krishnan, 2<sup>nd</sup> MA English, hosted the session and had 61 participants in total. Mr. A. Krishanand, Assistant Professor, Department of English, S.D College introduced the speaker to the audience. The resource person for the session was Dr. Sunitha Srinivas, Associate Professor, Government college, Mokeri, Kozhikode. The topic for the session was “*Mnemonic Legacies: The past in the present*”

.Speaker began her talk by 2:05 PM and she started her discourse on various aspects that memory plays before us. In the introductory session, she explained about the meaning of memory and the different methods by which memory gets through by explaining memory sites like literary text, monuments and archives. She considers memory as performative act because it is recollected and gathered as fragments and she puts forward the idea of memory as an archive, which includes fragments from past stored either as a text or museum or as a commemorating act. So she explained further that the commemorating act or the memory sites includes sort of encoding of events which occurred in the past but has an influence on our present. She elaborates on this process of working inside memory, which is fundamentally entangled or entwined in the notion of space, time, emotion, land scape, imagination and identity. So she explained that memory was not just recreating, its recalling and re-correcting. She further pointed out the connection between history and memory and elaborated on the history of memory. It can be considered as a history of creating or sharing heritage and thinking and explains further giving examples, that we find in antiquity, tracing examples from philosophers like Homer, Cecero, Socrates to modern writers; Freud, Derrida, Deleuze etc. She presented the idea of Deleuze's view of memory that "Memory is reterritorialization", and further explained the notion of "counter memory" put forwarded by Nietzsche which can be considered as a tool of resistance and negation. She added that tradition indicates the continuity of past, instilled in various sites of memory. According to her the unreliability, that the memory possess, is the human tentancy to stable past through history and can be considered as dominant idea in memory studies .She points out that memory is allogenic, considering it as a geological metaphor describing about sediments that was transported to the present from different position usually in the context of memory from the past. The holocaustic experience can be considered as an example. She continued the session by analyzing the constituents of memory. Basically, it can be considered as a mental capacity, retrieving something that happened in the past. So, she explained the idea of erasure in which the original past no longer exist and only recreated and reconstructed past exists. She mentioned that erasure was a problem in the context of colonialism and post colonialism which mentions the notion of absence. She elaborated on the notion of temporality and spatiality of memory by mentioning the words of John Locke and Plato. She further pointed out that the literary texts can be considered as the document of glorious past, articulating various memory of an entire generation in different point of time and explained the importance of the narrator and narrative mode in the literary text as an articulation of memory, citing examples of *David Copperfield* by Charles Dickens, *Mrs Dalloway* by Virginia Wolf, *The Hand Maid's Tale* by Margret Atwood, *Museum of Innocence* by Orhan Pamuk etc, which presented the idea of alienation, nostalgia, displacement, trauma etc. She concluded the session by providing information about the manipulation of memory in memory sites by the Government or the public spaces at 3 pm. The session was open to discussions and a interative discussion were carried out from 3PM to 3:30PM. Participants actively participated in the live session and share their thought about the topic. Towards the end of the session, the audience were asked to fill up the feedback form to share their experience and to provide suggestions for the future endeavours. The session was concluded by the vote of thanks proposed by Dr Bindu Nair, Associate Professor, Department of English, SD college at 3.35pm.

The fourth plenary session was followed by two technical sessions which started simultaneously in two different links at 3.30pm. Technical session 8 commenced after the fourth plenary session at 3.36 pm. The link for the technical session was same as that of fourth plenary session and had 45 participants. The session comprised of 6 paper presentations. Mr. Krishnanand. A, Assistant Professor, Department of English, S D College, Alappuzha chaired the session. Mr. Akhil Krishnan, 2nd MA English hosted the session and introduced the six paper presenters and gave a hearty welcome to the participants. The first presentation was done by Sandeep. T.G, Assistant Professor, Dept of English, Sree Kerala Varma College, Thrissur on the topic. '*Mnemonic Retrospection and Politics of Cultural Representations: An Analysis of Selected poems of Yehuda Amichai*'. Anandhu S, Researcher and an Alumni of Christ University, Bangalore was the next

presenter and he presented the topic, *“Digital Immigrants and Digital Natives: Analyzing their Urban Triadic notion of Space, Memory & Identity”*. It was followed by the presentation of Rimpa Mondal, Student, Department of English and Cultural Studies, Punjab University, Chandigarh on the topic *“Cultural Memory: Colonial Zombie infesting cultures and screens”*. Following that, Shrishti Chakraborti, Mphil student, Department of English, University of Delhi, presented the paper titled *“Understanding Alternity and Self through culinary nostalgia in Imtiaz Dharker’s poetry”*. He concluded his talk by referring to the significance and relevance of the topics that have discussed and presented by different presenters based on memory studies in the 2 day National webinar. Ms. Neetha Prasad, Assistant Professor, Department of English, expressed her heart felt gratitude and thanks to each and everyone especially to the invited chief guest Dr. B. Hariharan. As of a personal note , she recollected her memory of Dr. B. Hariharan who was once her mentor and she expressed her sincere thanks to him by saying that "Hari sir taught us the importance of unlearning and his words still resonate in my memory ". She concluded her words by giving a short report of Day 1 , November 20. The whole session ended up at 5.53 pm with a short closing note by the moderater Ms. Jeena, II nd MA English student.


