THELINEER OZHUKUM NAVA KERALAM

The project named 'Thelineer Ozhukum Nava Keralam' was launched on 22nd March 2022 is a continuation of the successful project of the Suchitwa Mission 'Ini Njan Ozhukatte', a programme for the rejuvenation of water bodies including the rivers, streams, ponds and lakes. The NSS Volunteers of S. D. College registered as Volunteers in the 'Thelineer Ozhukum Nava Keralam' project to co-ordinate the activities in their respective local bodies as well as Suchitwa Mission. The main objective of the project is to protect all the rivers, streams and lakes. As part of the campaign, a wide range of activities werw formulated and implemented, including water management, water quality testing of water bodies, detection of pollutant sources, public sanitation, waste disposal, treatment and mass elimination of pollutant sources. The activities regarding renovation and preserving the premises are going on Thanakulam under the leadership of NSS Unit of S. D. College, Alappuzha in collaboration with Team Thanakulam.



PALLIATIVE CARE

NSS volunteers of SD College participated in the survey to collect the details regarding the needs of patients who require palliative care. Based on the data collected medicines and proper care were given to patients identified.



REGULAR HOME VISIT

Medical bed donation

The NSS unit donated medical bed to a patient who is the parent of one of the student of our college, who was bedridden in an accident. The adjustable cot was very helpful to the family to move the patient. Frequent visits were also made to the family to help them in caring the patient.



Providing fruits to patients

NSS volunteers of SD College provided fruits to poor patients of General hospital. Students themselves prepared paper bags for carrying the fruits. Fruits were bought and equally distributed.

Dialysis kits were distributed to 20 patients selected from the list of those who are undergoing dialysis on a regular basis in Medical College hospital, Vandanam, Alappuzha.

HARITHAM SANATANAM

Various vegetables were cultivated as part of “*Haritham Sanathanam*”. 52 bundles of spinach, 32 kg of bringal, 46 kg of tomato and 4 varieties of chillies were cultivated.

NSS volunteers of SD College took the first harvest from the vegetables they cultivated in the college. This was inaugurated by Sri. R Krishnan, President of Sanatana Dharma Vidyaasala and Sri. P Krishnakumar, Hon Manager of S D College. The event also marked the honouring of farmers who contribute a great deal to our society. The cultivated produces were donated to a local orphanage.



THANAKULAM ACTIVITIES

Thanakulam is a water body located near to S.D. College, Alappuzha. The three acre pond was polluted and surrounded by weeds. Subsequently a group of youngsters formed 'Team Thanakulam' and took over the rejuvenation of Thanakulam. NSS Unit of Alappuzha S.D. College cooperates with the activities of Team Thanakulam since 26th December 2021 during the Punarjjani Camp. Every month NSS volunteers involve themselves in the renovation activities of Thanakulam. As part of conservation activities in the first phase, native mango saplings were collected from the National Bureau of Plant Genetic Resources and planted near the bank of the pond. The main varieties like Karimeenakanni, Madathilpulisseri Mango, Aanapuliyani, and Sarkkarakatti. Shudham Sivamayam, Devaranyakam etc were planted there. A Nakshatravanam project also implemented in Thanakulam. Every third Saturday of a month, NSS volunteers are participating in the cleaning and preservation activities of Thanakulam. The project focuses on conserving the fragile ecosystem around the Thanakulam pond in view of preserving it for the generations to come. Also the project is an instance of community participation.
